- **Central Office volunteers:**

- ⇒ Helped coordinate **16; 12 step calls;**
 - five of those calls were handled by an after hour phone angel;
- ⇒ Assisted **2** individuals with **transportation** to meetings;
- ⇒ Provided information and **assistance** to **189 callers;**
- ⇒ Sold \$1,392.75 worth of literature for a profit of \$366.06;
- ⇒ Welcomed **52 visitors** to Oahu Central Office;
- ⇒ Trained **1** new volunteers in **June;**
 - Unfortunately **1** volunteer secured position and had to let go of volunteering at Central Office and another is on extended leave;
- ⇒ We currently have **20** in office volunteers covering **34** shifts;
- ⇒ **2** special project volunteers, and
- ⇒ Interviewed **1** new perspective volunteer.

- **After-Hours Phone Angel** volunteers assisted **200 callers;** and

- ⇒ Coordinated **5; 12th step calls.**
- ⇒ We currently have **20** After-Hour Phone Angels covering **21** shifts.
- ⇒ 5 Phone Angels Volunteers are covering more than one shift

- **12th Step** volunteers assisted **16 callers;** and

- ⇒ We currently have **22 men & 19 women** volunteering for 12th Step work; covering all 7 Districts on Oahu

- **Transportation** volunteers assisted **2 callers;** and

- ⇒ We have **7 groups** on the transportation list, as well we have 10 men and 11 women from the 12th step list volunteering to transport visitors, new comers and our elders to AA meetings on Oahu.
- **Translation** volunteers assisted **0 callers**; and
 - ⇒ We currently have **11 members** willing to translate French, Filipino, Japanese, Spanish, Chinese, Korean and Russian.
