- **Central Office volunteers:**

- ⇒ Helped coordinate **8; 12 step calls;**
 - None of those calls were handled by an after hour phone angel;
- ⇒ Assisted **0** individual with **transportation** to meetings;

- ⇒ Sold \$2,487.55 worth of literature for a profit of \$620.02;
- ⇒ **Welcomed 85 visitors** to Oahu Central Office;
- ⇒ Trained **2** new volunteers in **October;**
- ⇒ We currently have **24** in office volunteers covering **34** shifts;
- ⇒ **2** special project volunteers, and
- ⇒ Interviewed **2** new perspective volunteer.

- **After-Hours Phone Angel** volunteers assisted **210 callers;** and

- ⇒ We have **8 groups** on the transportation list. We have 10 men and 11 women from the 12th step list volunteering to transport visitors, newcomers and our elders to AA meetings on Oahu.

- ⇒ We currently have **11 members** willing to translate French, Filipino, Japanese, Spanish, Chinese, Korean and Russian.
